FROM PASTOR MICHAEL



Being A People of Integrity

Yes, these are the waning days of summer – already we are approaching the beginning of August. On occasion I have seen leaves turning color forewarning the observer – it is time to prepare for shorter and cooler days as we move toward the beauty and splendor of fall, while at the same time anticipating the wonder of winter.

It has been a really spectacular summer. Some sweltering days, some rain to keep things growing, and so many warm days that have allowed us to be in the out-of-doors and on the lakes. Families have gathered,

friends have come together, and there have been so many opportunities to hear good music and meet new friends.

While many have enjoyed the wonders of a northern Minnesota summer (including mosquitoes and black flies – it can't all be perfect) there have been undercurrents flowing uneasily on this planet we call "earth." As the Webb telescope reveals the wonder of the whole cosmos and creation, cracks appear on our polar caps and ice is rapidly melting at unheard rates. While Minnesota has had reasonable weather, parts of Europe and the western United States are breaking records for heat, fire, and catastrophic conditions. Climate change gallops forward unabated. As we fill our gas tanks, we note the price is going down (\$4.09 per gallon as I write this), but inflation continues to challenge our budgets to the extreme. National politics in all three branches vacillate between being dysfunctional and in gridlock, or destructive to the health of our democracy – with occasional glimmers of some decent work completed by our legislators. As a nation we continue to experience gun violence daily, racial inequities, an expanding gap between wealth and poverty . . . and we do not know where all this ends or what one can do to reduce the tensions and inequities. How do we find the path forward where we are able to walk together as we seek solutions to so may problems that face us . . . every day!

What to do? I would challenge us to always be a people of continuing and expanding faith. Have faith in one who does not walk away from us. Have faith in the one who has set forth a vision to love always, forgive abundantly, and always act in compassionate ways leading to justice for all who dwell in God's creation. Yes, the problems seem unsurmountable – and many will not be solved in one, or two, or three election cycles. God has been with God's creation in times of abundance and scarcity, prosperity and poverty, freedom and oppression, hope, and despair. Over and over the people Israel moved from being a landed people to being a people scattered in exile – and finally the diaspora. Know that as we take on the long view for the generations come, God walks with us and waits for us at the end of the road. Our kind words, our empathetic actions, our courageous decisions become the building blocks and mortar of a foundation building the KIN-dom of the Divine. Because of the presence of Creator, the wisdom of Christ, and the creativity of Spirit – we will be effective, making an enormous difference. Don't give up!

While you follow in the ways of faith, pause – smell, hear, and see all the wonders of God's creation. Love yourself as you love creation and your neighbor. As Parker Palmer has written, "Selfcare is never a selfish act—it is simply good stewardship of the only gift I have, the gift I was put on earth to offer to others." May it be so!

July 19, 2022

Moderator Gay Jacobson called the meeting to order.

Pastor Small opened the meeting with a prayer.

As our new moderator, Gay provided us with a brief but information-rich introduction to herself. Suffice to say, she has had an interesting life and is more than qualified to be our moderator and lead our congregation now and into the future.

Gay outlined three norms she wishes to establish as moderator – all are intended to promote an efficient and smooth execution of the council meetings.

- 1. Timeliness: meetings will start on time at 7 pm and end on time at 8 pm.
- 2. No side conversations while someone is talking and has the floor. This is especially important for those attending virtually by Zoom; but also important to show respect for anyone who is speaking.
- 3. Minutes should be to Pastor Small by noon on Thursday following the council meeting.

Minutes from the June 21, 2022 meeting were reviewed. Deb moved and Doris seconded to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

The treasurer's written report was reviewed.

The following boards provided a verbal report:

<u>Spiritual Life:</u> Ruth is the chair. Could use more members. Deb said she would help anytime, in particular with serving communion. We will continue to use the individually packaged communion cups/wafer until they are all used up, then the plan is to return to the regular serving of communion.

<u>Music Board:</u> Joanna and Linda will be co-chairs. Ken Barber held a workshop/training on the new outdoor sound system. A notebook has been created with instructions and information. Linda and Joanna have gone through the training. Anyone else interested in learning how to set up and use this sound equipment can contact Ken. An outdoor service will be held on July 31st. Joann Pels will be providing special music on July 31st.

Board of Trustees: Gary Jacobson is the chair. He reported as follows.

- 1. New possibility to hang bell will be pursued with a different metal fabricator (Klave) in Walker.
- 2.Tim has spoken with Brian Gray regarding some deterioration on one of the stone support structures. Brian recommended talking to a contractor and getting a concrete

rim poured around it. He feels it is cosmetic at this point and not structural.

- 3.Tim and Ryan will assess the open vent outside the boiler room.
- 4. The sign refurbishing is underway. New shingles are being put on. The new sign insert is being laid out at Amity graphics.
- 5.Re-staining of the church. A list of possible businesses were generated by the members. They will be contacted and asked to consider submitting a bid.
- 6.We need a better overview of our finances and budget before proceeding with any major projects. That will be one of the next considerations for the BOT.
- 7. Welcome new board member Ryan Pels.

Women's Fellowship: Next Women's Fellowship Meeting will be Tuesday, August 16th at 1:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall. Quilts of Love Project will resume on July 24th at 1:00 pm, and again on August 9th and 23rd. We hope to be joined by the quilters of Hope Lutheran and St. Agnes, as we work to complete our 22 quilts. All who wish to participate are WEL-COME as we show others that we care about them. Beth Alderson is our Team Leader.

Esther moved and Bonnie seconded to accept all reports as presented and/or submitted. Motion carried.

Pastor's Update

- •Our new secretary is Sabbastian Wilson-Webb. Details of his job duties (including picking up the mail from our PO box and sorting it) are still being worked out. He will keep office hours on Thursdays. Pastor will be working with Sabbastian on our Website and on a Facebook page for our church.
- •The next book study will be *Braiding Sweetgrass by Robin Wall Kimmerer*. It will start after Labor Day. All members will receive a Zoom invite.
- •Pastor is looking forward to meeting with the boards as we start our new fiscal year.
- •He will be gone August 28th, Spiritual Life will arrange for pulpit supply.
- •Pastor noted that one of the issues for our church is "identity." He is looking forward to working with the council on this during the coming year.
- •Pastor noted that this has been a most challenging month both in terms of personal and family health and the needs of our congregation. He is grateful for the support and caring shown by our congregation for him and his family personally.
