- 8. Neighbors In Need Offering taken on Sunday, October 2nd. In 2022, the Neighbors in Need "BEHOLD!" offering focuses on an economic justice. With inflation impacting all of our households, we wanted to provide a way to discuss this through a faith lens. Join us by promoting this year's NIN "Behold!" campaign at your church. As you may recall, one-third of the offering supports Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds are used by Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants to UCC churches and organizations as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects.
- 9. **World Communion Sunday** is celebrated on Sunday October 2. The theme for this service is "**At Last!**" as we focus on a unique text for this Sunday **Genesis 2:18-24**¹. It is a second creation story, the creation of humans drawn into relationship. Curiously, the translation below refers to Adam as "the earth creature". After a deep sleep, the earth creature is divided into two halves, on male the other female. I invite you to read with curiosity the below text.
 - ¹⁸ Then YHWH said, "It is not good for the earth creature to be alone. I will make a fitting companion for it." ¹⁹ So from the soil YHWH formed all the various wild beasts and all the birds of the air, and brought them to the earth creature to be named. Whatever the earth creature called each one, that became its name. ²⁰ The earth creature gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of the air, and all the wild animals.

But none of them proved to be a fitting companion, ²¹ so YHWH made the earth creature fall into a deep sleep, and while it slept, God divided the earth creature in two, then closed up the flesh from its side. ²² YHWH then

fashioned the two halves into male and female, and presented them to one another.²

When the male realized what had happened, ²³ he exclaimed, "This time, this is the one!

Bone of my bone and flesh of my flesh!

Now, she will be Woman, and I will be Man, because we are of one flesh!"³

² The literal translation is, "...and while the earth creature (the adâm) slept, God took one of its sides [or possibly, ribs] and closed up the flesh in its place. ²² Then YHWH made the part that was taken from the adâm into a woman and brought her to the adâm." But if the earth creature is without gender before woman is created, then surely it becomes gendered when the split takes place—hence our rendering of the passage.

 - Do you measure your faith? What are appropriate benchmarks?
 - How have you demonstrated great faith? In what ways would you like to see your faith increased?
 - What needs to be uprooted and replanted in your life...by faith?
