### FROM PASTOR MICHAEL

### 2023 - New Beginnings

It was 1999 when a parishioner approached me and said, "I guess I won't be able to die!" Quizzically, I asked, "What makes you say that?" She said, "When my husband died years ago, we also put on the headstone my name, birthdate, and then for the date of death it read '19\_\_\_' to be filled after my death." Obviously, she would not pass until we were well into the 2000's, therefore she could not die. Of course, we laughed, and celebrated her long and healthy life.

It is hard to believe that we are approaching the "Year of our Lord 2023"! Will this be a year of new beginnings? Will this be the year when we finally turn the proverbial corner? Will this be the year when we experience the end of our warring ways? Will this be the year when we are really kinder, gentler, more loving, and more forgiving? Can we be intentional about making this a year of many new beginnings? Or, will we just fall back on old patterns, and old ways – stuck because those ways that seem to be carved into a headstone that speaks about past and . . . death.

I am optimistic, I know that I, that we, we together we can do better. Just this past month I was looking at the stunning images of the Webb telescope. New and exciting discoveries are being made daily. Only last month scientists had an amazing breakthrough. "At 1 a.m. on 5 December, researchers at the National Ignition Facility (NIF) in California finally did it, focusing 2.05 megajoules of laser light onto a tiny capsule of fusion fuel and sparking an explosion that produced 3.15 MJ of energy—the equivalent of about three sticks of dynamite." The implications are astounding, we are on the verge of creating truly clean energy. And I sense a spirit in the generations to come of creativity, brilliance, and the will to be about the changes needed to make earth a place of health and equity for all. Yes, I think the arc of the moral universe is bending toward equity, health, mercy, and justice for all. Let us all lean into that moral arc!

Of the United Church of Christ, the foundational principles are, in part, are "That they may all be one", "Never place a period where God has placed a comma", "No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey – you are welcome here", the three loves of the UCC "Love of Neighbor, Children, and Creation", and that we are "United in Christ's love, we seek justice for all – A Just World for ALL!" It really is about radical welcome and hospitality seen through the lens of unconditional love and extravagant forgiveness FOR ALL! (including ourselves).

With the daily scientific breakthroughs of our time, combined with all of our communities of faith (both those who are ancient long-standing and those who are emerging), combined with the mysterious presence of the divine, combined with the dreams and visions of our elders and our youth, loved ones and strangers, indigenous and immigrant – we have the tools to navigate into the stormy waters of all the challenges we face – and come to the other side – a future with promise for all.

2023 – it is a time for new beginnings – let us make it so with a spirit of gratitude and joy!



### **Book Conversation to Begin**

# Speak with the Earth and it Will Teach You by Daniel Cooperrider


A Zoom invitation will be sent out for book conversation set to begin at 7:00 pm on Wednesday, January 11. This will be a weekly meeting. Potential reads are Speak with the Earth and it Will Teach You by Daniel Cooperrider – a UCC pastor residing outside of Madison WI. Of this book it is written – "I don't think it is enough appreciated how much an outdoor book the Bible is," wrote Wendell Berry, and author Daniel Cooperrider illustrates his point with beautiful narrative-like a stroll through the woods.

Speak with the Earth analyzes the Bible's treatment of nature and intersperses this analysis with the author's own reflections on experiences in nature. Organized in sections touching on the four ele-

ments, the book engages with the multifaceted relationship between the Bible and nature through various media, including art, theology, the natural sciences, history, and lived experience. A timely work on the gift of the Earth that makes a strong case for environmental conservation as a cornerstone of religious life.

This book is published by the UCC's Pilgrim Press and is available (December 21st) through Amazon. The Kindle version is \$11.81 and the paperback is \$24.95.

Other suggestions are Starry Messenger: Cosmic Perspectives on Civilization by Neil deGrasse Tyson, or And There Was Light: Abraham Lincoln and the American Struggle by Jon Meacham.


### CHURCH TO BE CLOSED FOR CLEANING
