FROM PASTOR MICHAEL



Awakening!

On my list of books to read is one written by a colleague Catherine Duncan called Everyday Awakening: Five Practices for Living Fully, Feeling Deeply, and Coming into Your Heart and Soul.

Awakening! Isn't that what we are experiencing as days lengthen with the power of the sun, the earth warms, perennials break through the soil, trees bud, lakes are open, and the winds blow. It is as if winds and rain from the south are filled with Spirit of God, coming once again, to baptize the earth with sunshine, moonshine,

rains – waters that bring forth life, light that creates life abundant!

The earth, the land, the lakes that seemed dormant have come to life – they have awakened. With gratitude, these are the predictable cycles of nature, yearly reminding us that there is a natural rhythm to the cosmos – from conception/creation to birth, growth, awakening, life, death . . . re-birth, growth, awakening, life, death, and this pattern is repeated eternally!

As we approach summer with the return of snowbirds, the Gazebo Concerts, the opportunities for worship, study, prayer may we awaken to how God is calling us to be in the world, this place we call home!

During our times together I invite you to place six biblical texts on your plate. Read them – again and again. Hear the words speaking to you and calling you to the work of awakening to the Realm, the Kingdom of God in our midst. These recommendations come from author and editor Jim Wallis.

BACK TO THE TEXTS (from Wallis, Jim. The False White Gospel (p. 231). St. Martin's Publishing Group.)

<u>**Genesis 1:26:**</u> "Then God said, let us make humankind in our own image, according to our own likeness." Do we believe that all of us were created after God's own image and likeness—or not?

Luke 10:25–37: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." Do we believe that our love for our neighbors who are different from us determines our love for God—or not?

John 8:32: "You will know the truth and the truth will make you free." Do we believe that not knowing the truth and submitting to lies will take away our freedom—or not?

<u>Matthew 25:31–46:</u> "As you have done to the least of these, you have done to me." Do we believe these words in this last teaching of Jesus, before he went into Jerusalem; that how we treat the poor and vulnerable is literally how we treat Christ himself—or not?

<u>Matthew 5:9:</u> "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God." Do we believe that the peacemakers, not the dividers, are God's real children—or not?

Galatians 3:28: "There is no longer Jew or Gentile, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male or female, for all of you are one in Christ." Do we believe these words of the apostle Paul; that we are not just old tribes but meant to become a new community—or not?

Awaken my friends, awaken to the ways and truth of Jesus as seek to speak and live truth, laying the foundation for the Realm of God in our midst. Thanks be to God.



Pentecost Sunday – May 19 – 10:00 a.m.



1956

On November 3, 1956, Rev. Hammond tendered his resignation after thirty-six years of service in the Walker Church. The congregation was reluctant to accept his resignation and urged him to continue as pastor until such

time as he felt it absolutely necessary to retire. He consented to serve until such time GLADYS LA MUSGA as another pastor could be found.

1957

EDITH LA ROSA April 14, 1957, the members of the Church voted to unite with the Hackensack Congregation in hiring of a minister. Up until September 1, 1957, Rev. Hammond, together with guest speakers, served the Walker Church,

and in the meantime a Pulpit Committee was appointed and a diligent search made for a minister. Upon severance of his pastoral duties, Rev. Hammond was made Minister Emeritus of the Community Church. During October and November 1957, Rev. Suzanna Olson served as Interim Pastor, serving both the Walker and Hackensack parishes. On November 25, 1957, a call was extended to Rev. Harold A. Mercier to become permanent pastor of the "Yoked Parish" of Walker and Hackensack.

1958

Early in the year of 1958, a Church Council was organized, its duty being to handle routine business or refer such business to the proper board or committee. One of the first duties performed by the newly organized council was the preparation of a constitution and by-laws and a revision of the membership list. On January 12, 1958, a Men's Fellowship was reactivated with eighteen members, Jake Licke being elected

president, and Dr. H. Brown, secretary-treasurer. On March 23, 1958, Rev. Harold A. Mercier was installed as pastor of the Yoked Parish of Walker and Hackensack.



The service was a very impressive one and was attended by the Hackensack Congregation and many visiting pastors and laymen throughout the State. One of the most important problems of the year was to provide adequate and needed living quarters for the pastor and his family. Property in Quam's First Addition to Walker was purchased from Orville Ellis. A new parsonage was built under the supervision and direction of Mr. Alston Alto, the cost of the property and building being

The new parsonage was ready for occupancy in October 1958, and on November 30 an Open House was held and the new building dedicated.
