CALL TO WORSHIP

One: Christ gives us a new commandment:

All: "Love one another as I have loved you."

One: The Peace of Christ be with you.

- As my Abba has loved me, so have I loved you.

EASTER SEASON COMMUNION – John 21:1-14

INVITATION

One: Dearest friends, at this table the Spirit welcomes us all. Here she gives special honor to the hungry and the poor. Here she renews creation with healing and peace. Here she pledges a graceful world to come, a world of joy and dignity for all. And here she lets us taste it, the new way of being together: bearing each other's burdens, sharing each other's joys, practicing pardon, eating in peace, justice in all we say and do. So come to the Spirit's table. Receive new life.

It is for you, for me, for everyone.

PRAISE

- One: Let us pray: From the first day to the last, O God, you are generous and kind, filling the world with mercy's bread, pouring the cup of mercy's joy.
- All: You give us gifts too many to count: our hearts overflow when we remember you. Even in death, life abounds.
- One: And so we praise you, singing your glory with every creature you made:
- **SING** Praise God from whom all blessings flow; Praise Christ the Word in flesh born low;

Praise Holy Spirit evermore; One God, Triune, whom we adore.

REMEMBERING JESUS

One: And now, O God, with grateful hearts, we remember Jesus.
When all seems lost, when we are stuck in shame, when nothing we try resurrects our fading hope, Jesus comes to us; Jesus brings the morning's light. Jesus tells us where to cast our nets.
The catch is abundant; our nets are full.
Jesus knows we are always hungry; Jesus feeds us hope.
On the lakeshore Jesus lights the breakfast fire, grills fish for us, and bread.
In the mist of morning, guilt is gone, shame fades away.
We eat together, speaking only of love.
It is always this way with Jesus— food and pardon, mercy and life.

Even on that night when we betrayed him, Jesus gave us bread and wine and Jesus told us to remember him and all his mercies whenever we gather to eat.

PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

One: Then come, Holy Spirit, bless this bread and cup, signs of the Living One truly present here in love. For all who receive these gifts in faith, make them food and drink of lasting life, until the new age of justice comes and every creature beholds it. In Christ's name we pray. Amen.

THE DISTRIBUTION

(When the bread is given, hold on to the bread until all have been served. Take and eat together knowing that together, we are a part of the Body of Christ. When the cup is given, drink when you are ready, acknowledging that you are a child of God.)

THE BLESSING

One: May the presence of Christ, Body, and Spirit, keep and preserve you to everlasting life.

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

All: Gracious God, we thank you for this mystery in which you have given yourself to us. You have called us to return always to the still, life-giving center where you have fed and healed us. Send us into the world now, to listen for your guiding and to follow your Word, to take your good news to others near and far, in words and in deeds, and so to be a part of your transformation of the world, in the name of Christ and the power of your Holy Spirit. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE/PASTORAL PRAYER

THE LORD'S PRAYER (Unison, using debts)

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.
