¹ In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, Philip his brother tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene. ² In those days, during the highpriesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the Word of God came to John, ben-Zechariah, in the desert. ³ John went through the entire region of the Jordan proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, ⁴ as is written in the words of Isaiah, the prophet:
