CALL TO WORSHIP

One: We come to worship because we long for mercy.

All: We long for community. We long for God.

One: We come to worship because we need a good word.

All: We need connection. We need moral reminders.

One: We come to worship because we are in between:

All: hope and grief,

faith and doubt, joy and longing,

curiosity and conviction.

One: So we come to worship and God meets us here.

All: Surely, we are not alone. Thanks be to God for meeting us in the middle!

A TIME OF CENTERING

PRAYER OF INVOCATION

One: God meets us in the night—

All: before the sun rises, before the wound heals,

All: where joy is effervescent,

where laughter is contagious,

where flowers bloom from cracks in the sidewalk,

where people gather around tables.

One: God meets us in between-

All: at the edge of the water,

at the beginning of the wilderness,

at the start of something new,

on the edge of faith.

One: And if God meets us in all those places,

All: then surely God meets us everywhere—

at the water's edge,

at the start of something new,

after the baptism, and before the call.

One: We are not alone. God is all around.

All: Let us worship the God of everything.

CALL TO CONFESSION

One: Friends, our faith calls us to live with both mercy and righteousness.

Somewhere along the way, however, we have forgotten that truth.

Somewhere along the way, we began arguing about who deserves mercy and whether or not they had acted with enough righteousness to receive it.

Fortunately, God does not act that way.

No matter what mistakes we have made or wrong turns we've taken, God consistently meets us with mercy and invites us to try again. So let us lean into that good news, and go to God in prayer:

PRAYER FOR TRANSFORMATION AND NEW LIFE

All: Merciful God,

When we fail to be righteous,

- ¹ Entering Jericho, Jesus passed through the city. ² There was a wealthy person there named Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector. ³ Zacchaeus was trying to see who Jesus was, but he coudn't do so because of the crowd, since he was short.
- ⁴ In order to see Jesus, Zacchaeus ran on ahead, then climbed a sycamore tree that was along the route. ⁵ When Jesus came to the spot, he looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, hurry up and come on down. I'm going to stay at your house today." ⁶ Zacchaeus quickly climbed down and welcomed Jesus with delight.
- ⁷ When everyone saw this, they began to grumble, "Jesus has gone to a sinner's house as a quest."
- ⁸ Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to Jesus, "Here and now I give half my belongings to poor people. If I've defrauded anyone in the least, I'll pay them back fourfold."
- ⁹ Jesus said to the tax collector, "Today salvation has come to this house, for this is what it means to be a descendant of Sarah and Abraham. 10 The Promised One has come to search out and save what was lost."

RESTORING PURE OF HEART

- ¹ Creator Sets Free (Jesus) was walking through Moon Village (Jericho). ² There, a man named Pure of Heart (Zacchaeus), who was a head tribal tax collector with many possessions, ³ was trying to see who was coming but was too short to see over the crowd. ⁴ So he ran ahead and climbed up a tall tree to get a better view.
- ⁵ When Creator Sets Free (Jesus) came to the tree, he looked up and said, "Pure of Heart (Zacchaeus), come down from there and take me to your house, for I need a place to rest."
- ⁶ He quickly climbed down the tree and with a glad heart welcomed him into his house. ⁷ But when the people saw this, they shook their heads. "What is he doing?" they grumbled out loud. "Why would he go into the house of an outcast?"
- ⁸ Pure of Heart (Zacchaeus) stood up to the crowd and said to Creator Sets Free (Jesus), "Hear me, Wisdomkeeper. I will give half my possessions to the ones who have none. If I have cheated anyone, I will give them back four times as much."
- ⁹ Creator Sets Free (Jesus) smiled and said, "This is a good day, because this man and his family have finally been set free. For he also is a descendant of Father of Many Nations (Abraham) who had lost his way. ¹⁰ The True Human Being has come to find the ones who have lost their way and guide them back again to the good road."
