

# FROM PASTOR MICHAEL



## Why Easter?

In all the times humans have walked upon the earth – I wonder – have humans changed? Over time there are changes in physique, health, longevity, location, population, and available resources. Again, the question is, has the essence of humanity changed? As thinking and feeling people are we much different than those who walked upon the earth in the first century or before, for instance? I don't think so.

As we read the ancient texts and try to imagine Abraham and Sarah wandering, Moses leading the people who moved from slavery in Egypt to

the promised land, and Jesus, the first followers, the disciples and the people of faith throughout the first century – I firmly think that they are ancestors who are like those in whom we dwell and abide with in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. They too experienced chaos, darkness, hard times. They knew about failed leadership and struggles to get along with one another. They had families and communities who gathered and tried their best to be in healthy relationships with one another. There were times when they failed, fought wars over limited resources and misunderstandings, experienced famine and drought. Over time they built communities and nations, they dreamed dreams and saw visions. We are the ones who follow in their footsteps.

As we approach Easter, can we once again discover why it is that we celebrate Easter? I think many of these stories were grounded in the diversity of the human experience – from loss and grief to joy and ecstasy, from hard reality to the mystery of this cosmic life all creation participates in.

We celebrate Easter because it speaks to experience and all our life cycles – from conception to birth – from infancy to becoming elders, from life, life abundant to death. Our Easter faith speaks to our fears and frustrations allowing us to move beyond self(ish) concerns to the concerns of the whole, all humanity. Our Easter faith reassures us that in all we do and all we experience that we are loved, we are safe, we are made whole in the never-ending presence of the continuing forces of Creator creating still, Spirit always breathing life into us, and Christ who is our constant companion – calling an guiding us to still waters while confronting all the challenges life throws at us. We no longer need to fear death!

Easter faith means we live life with the knowledge and hope of resurrection. No matter how dark and horrible life may be – we are always a resurrection people living life to the fullest without fear of death or destruction. As resurrection people we are called to be about healing for those who hurt the most, feeding for those who are hungry, reconciling for those who are in broken relationship, peacemaking for those who are at war, knitting together those who have been torn asunder, and being a people who radiate light for those who are lost in the darkness of despair.

As Eastern people we are always called to demonstrate, live out, embrace life and life abundant in all the places we journey. May we be these people with one another, with the stranger and the lost, with the poor and oppressed, with each other and with all of God's creation. You, we, all of us are a Easter people always expanding and opening the circle of God's beloved. Thanks be to od!

## Mission Moment

#### YWCA of Palestine - Jalazone Kindergarten and Community Center

What better way to support a more sustainable and hopeful future than to support and educate future generations? The YWCA of Palestine, a United Church of Christ partner through Global Ministries and supported by One Great Hour of Sharing, has engaged local Palestinian communities since 1893.

Today, it offers programs of economic empowerment, women's rights, youth leadership, and children's education. An example of the latter is the YWCA's nursery schools and kindergartens in refugee camps, schools the YWCA has run for decades. In addition to regular classes, the YWCA offers skill-based camps such as photography and sports, as well as other extra-curricular activities at its schools.

In the occupied Palestinian West Bank, roughly one-fourth of the 900,000 Palestinian refugees registered with the United Nations live in 19 refugee camps. The YWCA kindergarten in the Jalazone Refugee Camp near Ramallah is a sign of hope for a community that has endured over 75 years of displacement.

The school and connected community center address the needs of over 80 children and their families within the camp. In a place that is often subjected to raids and night-time patrols by the Israeli military, children are not immune from the trauma the residents of the camp experience. As a result, the YWCA has added awareness and counselling sessions to regular classes to help improve the psychological well-being of the children there.

The opportunities that the YWCA affords the community through the kindergarten benefit the children, their families, and the teachers as well, providing a safe space for play and employing techniques to cope with the stress of daily life living in sub-par circumstances of a refugee camp under military occupation.

The pride the children have when they dress up for their graduation ceremony is palpable. They enjoy the celebration of their accomplishment, and anticipate their next stages of education and life better able and prepared for the challenges they will face.
