Call to Worship (Inspired by Psalm 46)

PRAYER OF INVOCATION

One: Holy Redeemer,

PRAYER FOR TRANSFORMATION AND NEW LIFE

All: Divine Grace.

Jesus promises paradise to his neighbor on the cross. No matter what transgression the person had carried out, Jesus still promised a future filled with hope, mercy, and filled with your love. And yet, even when we pray "your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven," we like to limit paradise for our neighbors. We quietly ask: What have they done in their lives that they must ask for help, receive assistance, and lack health? Yet what we don't realize is that their misfortunes are not for us to judge. Beloved God, open our hearts wide to mercy – both in receiving and in extending it to others. May we shun judgment and open our hearts to a paradise here on earth where all your children can abide in peace and wholeness. Amen.

- ³² Two others were also led off with Jesus, criminals who were to be put to death. ³³ When they had reached the place called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there—together with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴ And Jesus said, "Abba forgive them. They don't know what they are doing." Then they divided his garments, rolling dice for them.
- ³⁵ The people stood there watching. The rulers, however, jeered him and said, "He saved others, let him save himself—if he really is the Messiah of God, the Chosen One!" ³⁶ The soldiers also mocked him. They served Jesus sour wine ³⁷ and said, "If you are really the King of the Jews, save yourself!" ³⁸ There was an inscription above Jesus that read, "This is the King of the Jews."
- ³⁹ One of the criminals who hung there beside him insulted Jesus, too, saying, "Are you really the Messiah? Then save yourself—and us!"
- ⁴⁰ But the other answered the first with a rebuke: "Don't you even fear God? ⁴¹ We are only paying the price for what we have done, but this one has done nothing wrong!"
 - ⁴² Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your glory."
 - ⁴³ Jesus replied, "The truth is, today you'll be with me in paradise!"

Nailed to the Cross

- ³³ When they came to the place called "The Skull," they nailed the hands and feet of Creator Sets Free (Jesus) to a tree-pole—the cross. They did the same for the two criminals, putting one on each side of him.
- ³⁴ "Father, forgive them!" Creator Sets Free (Jesus) cried out. "They do not know what they are doing."

The soldiers divided up his garments and gambled for them by drawing straws.

- ³⁵ The people watched as the spiritual leaders mocked him. "He set others free," they said, "why can he not free himself, if he is Creator's Chosen One?"
- ³⁶ The soldiers offered Creator Sets Free (Jesus) wine mixed with bitter herbs ³⁷ and mocked him. "If you are the Great Chief of the tribes," they laughed, "then set yourself free."
- ³⁸ Above his head, carved above the crossbeam, were these words in three languages:

THIS IS THE CHIEF OF THE TRIBES OF WRESTLES WITH CREATOR

[†] For those who are able, please stand.

- ³⁹ One of the thieves next to him spewed out angry words, "If you are the Chosen One, save yourself and us!"
- ⁴⁰ Then the other thief spoke up and said, "Have you no fear or respect for the Great Spirit? ⁴¹ We are guilty and suffering for our own wrongdoings, but this man has done nothing wrong!"
- ⁴² The man *turned to Creator Sets Free (Jesus) and* said to him, "Honored One, remember me when you come into the power of your good road."
- ⁴³ Creator Sets Free (Jesus) looked at the man and said, "Listen closely, before the sun sets today, you will walk with me in the beautiful garden."
