- <sup>5</sup> In the days of the ruler Herod, there was a priest named Zechariah, of the priestly class of Abijah. His wife Elizabeth was a descendant of Aaron. <sup>6</sup> Both were worthy in the sight of God and scrupulously observed all the commandments and observances of our God. <sup>7</sup> They were childless—unable to conceive—and they were both advanced in years.
- <sup>8</sup> Now it was the turn of Zechariah's priestly class to serve. And as he was fulfilling his priestly office before God, <sup>9</sup> it fell to him by lot, according to priestly usage, to enter the sanctuary of our God and offer incense. <sup>10</sup> While the full assembly of people was praying outside at the time of day when the incense was offered, <sup>11</sup> an angel of our God appeared to him, standing to the right of the altar of incense. <sup>12</sup> Zechariah was deeply disturbed upon seeing the angel, and was overcome with fear.
- <sup>13</sup> The angel said to him, "Don't be frightened, Zechariah. Your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear a son, whom you'll name John.
